### **IHRA sealed Eight healthcare establishments over different malpractices**

ISLAMABAD: The Islamabad Healthcare Regulatory Authority (IHRA) has sealed eight Healthcare Establishments (HCEs) in different areas of ICT.

IHRA inspection teams carried out inspections of 100 Healthcare Establishments (HCEs) in different areas of Islamabad Capital Territory during the past four weeks.

Perfect Lab, National Hospital Rawat, Dawat Pharmacy and Health Clinic, Family Clinic, Jehangir Aman Dental Care, Bab Al Madina Clinic & Laboratory, Al Raheem Medical Centre, Bilal Clinic were sealed due to malpractices like absence of qualified medical staff, unhygienic conditions administering expired medicines and used syringes to patients and absence of proper waste management system, not getting registration with IHRA and keeping the medical facility functional despite sealing & suspension orders from the Authority.

IHRA suspended the services of four Healthcare Establishments (HCEs) over different medical non-compliances. Hashim Medical Center, Islamabad International Hospital & Research Center, Hasnain Medical Centre, Haris Medical and Dental Complex were suspended.

55 Healthcare Establishments were served notices for minor non-compliances and instructed to comply with the directions given by inspections team. 26 HCEs were found closed upon arrival by inspection teams. 7 Healthcare Establishments (HCEs) were recommended for registration and revocation of suspended services.

IHRA inspection teams also conducted visits to various public sector healthcare establishments, including BHU Pulgran, RHC Tarlai, CHC Shah Allah Dita and instructed to comply with the directions given by the inspection teams for improvements.

HRA inspection teams also visited Blood Bank of Rawal General & Dental Hospital, Shifa International Hospital, Medicsi, Pakistan Red Crescent Society (PRCs), CDC, Watim General and Dental Hospital.

The IHRA aims to ensure that the healthcare institutions meet the necessary requirements for the safe and effective handling of blood products, which is crucial for patient care.
