IHRA sealed two healthcare establishments over different malpractices

ISLAMABAD: The Islamabad Healthcare Regulatory Authority (IHRA) has sealed two Healthcare Establishments (HCEs) in different areas of ICT.

IHRA inspection teams carried out inspections of 45 Healthcare Establishments (HCEs) in different areas of Islamabad Capital Territory during the past three weeks.

Naimat Shah Clinic and Bilal Clinic were sealed due to malpractices like absence of qualified medical staff, unhygienic conditions and absence of proper waste management system, not getting registration with IHRA.

IHRA suspended the services of two Healthcare Establishments (HCEs) over different medical non-compliances. The Hospital, Saif Medical Center and Diagnostics were suspended.

29 Healthcare Establishments were served notices for minor non-compliances and instructed to comply with the directions given by inspections team. 7 HCEs were found closed upon arrival by inspection teams. 5 Healthcare Establishments (HCEs) were recommended for registration and revocation of suspension.

IHRA inspection teams also visited Blood Bank of Maroof International Hospital, MaxHealth Hospital and Pakistan Bait ul Mal Thalassemia Centre (Sundas Foundation) and instructed to comply with the directions given by the inspection teams for improvements.
